A signpost just says it's the *something* to health.

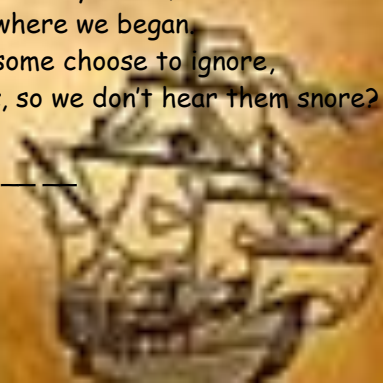
Clue 7
